

## Quick Quiz II

1. Home team is using DH for F9 in the 4<sup>th</sup> position in the lineup. In the 7<sup>th</sup> inning, because of an injury, the home coach wants the DH to move into the field and play first base. The coach does not want to change pitchers. The previous first baseman was batting the the 7<sup>th</sup> position of the lineup.
  - a. Legal substitution
  - b. Illegal substitution
  - c. The DH moves to the 7<sup>th</sup> position in the lineup
  - d. The DH remains in the 4<sup>th</sup> position in the lineup
  - e. F1 moves in the 4<sup>th</sup> position in the lineup
  - f. F1 moves into the 7<sup>th</sup> position in the lineup
2. Jones, a starter, is removed from the game for Smith. 2 innings later, the head coach approaches the umpire between innings and says Jones will bat for Smith. Jones is in the batter's box when the opposing head coach approaches the umpire and appeals the substitution.
  - a. Legal Substitution
  - b. Jones is out
  - c. Jones is ejected
  - d. Smith can come up to the plate since the discovery was made before the 1<sup>st</sup> pitch
  - e. Smith has been removed, but the offense can replace Jones with a legal substitution.
3. The home team's batting order is B1, B2, B3, etc. B3 is due up, but B4 bats in his place. B4 makes the 3<sup>rd</sup> out of the inning. In between innings (after all infielders have left the field and the home team is warming up on defense), the batting out of order is discovered by the visiting team's head coach.
  - a. The appeal is legal
  - b. The appeal is too late
  - c. B3 leads off the next inning
  - d. B4 leads off the next inning
  - e. B5 leads off the next inning
4. The visiting team's batting order is B1, B2, B3, etc. Each odd-numbered hitter is a left-hander, while the even-numbered hitters are right-handed. The defensive team has two good relievers, one left-handed and one right-handed. The defensive coach, having used no conferences during the game, wants to have the relieve pitchers switch every batter, while the other pitcher plays right field. The rules regarding conferences and substitutions do not apply.
  - a. There is no restriction on how many times a pitcher may leave and return as a pitcher
  - b. A pitcher can only leave the mound one time in an inning, but can return to the mound in as many innings as the coach prefers
  - c. A pitcher can only leave and return one time; after that, if he is removed, he cannot return.
